- Foreign workers or expatriate staff coming from areas affected by Dengue fever and/or Zika virus infection may go to the local Public Health Center for Dengue fever and/or Zika tests within 5 days of entering Taiwan. Those who voluntarily receive such tests will be given a NT\$250 coupon.

General symptoms

Fever at 38°C or above

Pain behind the eye socket

Muscular pain

Rash

Headache

Nausea

Joint pain



Alarm symptoms

Mucosal bleeding: gastrointestinal hemorrhage, menstrual bleeding, hematuria, nasal bleeding, gum bleeding, etc.

Continuous vomiting
(Unable to eat and drink)

Have urinated in 6 hours?

Hypersomnia, restlessness,
personality change

Continuous abdominal pain
or acute abdominal pain

Shortness of breath,
chest tightness or chest pain,
abdominal distension



For suspected infection of Dengue fever, you may go to a local contracted hospital or any Public Health Center for a test. Results will be released in 30 minutes at the fastest!



- In case of suspected Dengue fever symptoms, such as fever, headache, muscular and joint pain, and rash, please consult a doctor immediately.
- Inform the doctor of your travel history in the past two weeks voluntarily to facilitate diagnosis, treatment, and reporting.
